## SUNSHINE GUIDE TO DACCA AND THE DELTA, BANGLADESH

LOCATION: Dhaka (Dacca), the capital of Bangladesh, is located in the east-central part of the country. The city is situated on the delta of the combined Ganges and Brahmaputra Rivers (as is much of Bangladesh), at an elevation only slightly above sea level.

COMMENTS: The monsoons dominate the weather patterns of all of this area. Simply put, the southwest monsoons (mid-April through mid-October) bring heavy cloud, heavy rains, high relative humidities, and (about twice a year) severe tropical storms off the Bay of Bengal. During this season, much of the normally dry land is flooded. In years of exceptionally heavy rain, the floods can be widespread and devastating. The northeast monsoon (late October through early April) brings clear skies, fine weather, low humidities, and cooler temperatures. The duration and intensity of both of these seasons is subject to considerable variation from one year to another. Tropical cyclones off the Bay of Bengal are dangerous more from their flooding effects than from high winds. The safest thing to do when one is forecast, is to head for the high ground, well above any semblance of a flood plain. In Bangladesh, that is not always easy to do.
