SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE SHANGHAI AREA, CHINA

LOCATION: Shanghai, China's largest city and its major port, is located in the province of the same name (Shanghai-shi) in east-central China. The city is situated on the Huangpu River, a tributary of the Yangtze River's estuary. This location give the port a protected anchorage. Elevations are everywhere very close to sea level.

COMMENTS: Shanghai has a standard mid-latitude four-season year. Summers are long, hot, rainy, and humid. Winters are short, cold, relatively dry and relatively sunny. Spring and autumn are seasons of transitions, with spells of summer-like weather alternating with periods of winter-like weather at intervals of from three to five days. Precipitation is abundant in all seasons, with a summer maximum and a winter minimum. Shanghai is fortunate that it rarely gets the winter and spring dust storms that are so much a feature of the climate of the rest of northern China. Autumn (late September through late November) has the best weather of the year.
