COMMENTS: The region's climate is intermediate between a tropical desert and a monsoon climate. The rainy season runs from late June through early September in most years. The rest of the year is dry. Even during the rainy season, four out of five days are dry for all practical purposes. Humidities are quite low except during and immediately after the rain showers. The area reflects its near-desert characteristics by getting bright sunshine on three-fourths of its daylight hours over the year as a whole. This ranges from more than 90% in November, to just under half in rainy August. As befits its tropical location, below-freezing temperatures will not occur in most years. In really cold years, you might see frost once or twice in January or February. Obviously, snow is not a feature of the region's landscape. Dust storms can make things uncomfortable for a short while. They are most common in the hot season of April through June--just before the monsoon breaks. During the monsoon, sensible temperatures (the ones you actually feel) average about five degrees higher than actual ones. During the dry season, they will average about five degrees lower.
