SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE GRANDE PRAIRIE - PEACE RIVER COUNTRY, ALBERTA

LOCATION: This summary covers the area that lies in a broad-based triangle with Peace River as its northern apex, and Grande Prairie and Slave Lake as its western and eastern points respectively. This triangle occupies essentially the upper-middle basins of the Peace River and the Athabasca River. Most of it is either side of 2,000 feet above sea level. This is a productive agricultural area, and much of it is in small-grain farming and dairying. Edmonton is some 150 miles to the southeast.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 43% of the year's daylight hours. This might range from a low of 28% in December, to a high of 56% in July. The year's lowest temperature should be close to -36°, and the highest should be near 87°. Sensible afternoon temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be up to 4° cooler than actual ones during the warmer months, and essentially the same as actual ones during the rest of the year. The ground is usually frozen and snow-covered from late October through the middle of April. Afternoon temperatures will fail to warm to above the freezing point on roughly three-fourths of the days during this period, and the nights will drop below zero about half the time. Winter temperatures as low as the -60's have been recorded.
