## SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE SAINT JOHN AREA, NEW BRUNSWICK

LOCATION: Saint John is New Brunswick's largest city, and is located in the south-central portion of that province. The city is situated at the mouth of the Saint John River, where it empties into the Bay of Fundy. The name of the city, by the way, is always spelled in full, to distinguish it from St. John's in Newfoundland. Elevations, or course, are close to sea level. The city is both an industrial center and a major year-around port. Fundy National Park is located a few miles up the coast, on the shores of the Bay of Fundy.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 42% of the year's daylight hours. This might range from a low of 35% in November, to a high of 48% in August. The year's lowest temperature should be close to -12°, and the highest should be near 83°. Sensible afternoon temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be essentially the same as actual ones. The ground is usually frozen and snow-covered from late November through early April. However, during that time about half the afternoons will warm to above freezing. One of the chief climatic characteristics of this entire coast is the heavy and frequently persistent fogs that form over the Bay and roll inland—especially during the summer months.
