

SUNSHINE GUIDE TO ALBORG AND NORTHERN JUTLAND, DENMARK

LOCATION: Alborg is located in the northern part of Denmark's Jutland (Jylland) Peninsula. The city is situated on the Limfjorden, a fiord that cuts off the northern tip of the peninsula. Elevations are consequently close to sea level.

COMMENTS: Like almost all of northern Europe, Alborg has a four-season year. Summers are short, and moderately dry. Summer afternoons are long, more sunny than cloudy, and usually mild. Occasionally they are warm, but very rarely are they hot. Rains fall one day in three, with both the frequency and the intensity increasing as summer wears on. Summer nights are short, usually cool, occasionally chilly. Winters are long, cloudy, and moderately wet. Winter days are short, with most mornings starting out below freezing. In midwinter, one afternoon out of three will remain below freezing. The ground is usually snow-covered for most of the winter. From November through early February, half or more of the days will see no direct sunshine at all. At midwinter, the sun will only be less than 10° above the horizon at local noon, the highest it gets during the day. Spring and autumn are primarily seasons of vegetative change. The weather at these times of year is usually an alternation of warmer and cooler spells at intervals of from three to five days.
