SUNSHINE GUIDE TO OVIEDO AND ASTURIAS, SPAIN

LOCATION: Oviedo, the major city of the province of Asturias, is located in north-central Spain, about 20 miles south of the that country's northern coast. The city is situated on a hillside, facing the sea to the north, and surrounded by the foothills of the Cantabrian Mountains. Elevations are about 500 feet above sea level. The surrounding countryside is a fertile plateau.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine occurs on 38% of the year's daylight hours. This ranges from a low of 33% in January, to a high of 43% in August and September. The expected low temperature for the year will be around 27° at some windless winter sunrise, and the high will be near 90° on some sunny summer afternoon. Sensible afternoon temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will average some 3° cooler than actual ones. The area is strongly influenced by winds off the north Atlantic Ocean—especially during the cooler months. These tend to delay the onset of the various seasons somewhat over places farther inland. Summer afternoons are mild to warm, and summer nights are cool. Room cooling is rarely required to get a good night's sleep. An open window will almost always do the trick.
