SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE ISLAND OF NAXOS, GREECE

LOCATION: The island of Naxos is the largest and most attractive of the Cyclades Islands, and is located in the southern portion of the Aegean Sea. Elevations range from sea level to some 3,307 feet above it at the summit of Mount Zeus (also known as Oxia and Drios). The mountain chain which runs down the island is steepest to the east, but slopes gently to the west. Naxos is a fertile island, producing grapes, olives, citrus and speciality crops. It also produces marble and emery. In classical times, it was the center of the cult of Dionysos. Tourism is of increasing importance.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 61% of the daylight hours of the year. This might range from a low of 35% in January, to a high of 90% in August. The lowest temperature of the year should be close to on some calm and clear winter sunrise, and the highest should be near 92° on some sunny and windless summer afternoon. Sensible temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be pretty close to actual ones. The coastal areas enjoy a moderate climate—neither too hot nor too cold. Here, frost is rare but not unknown. Inland is a different matter, and the higher mountains are snow-capped much of the winter. The best weather comes from May through September.
