## SUNSHINE GUIDE TO PINNACLES NATIONAL MONUMENT, CALIFORNIA

LOCATION: Pinnacles National Monument is located in west-central California. The Monument is situated in the Gabilan Mountains, to the east of the Salinas Valley. The Monument covers some twenty-five square miles of wilderness, featuring finger-like, red-rock volcanic pinnacles, numerous caves, and seasonal birding and wildflowers. These are low mountains, with elevations generally up to 3,300 feet. The Monument is serviced by CA-146 from both sides, from San Benito and from Soledad. However, the road is not continuous through the Monument. At the present time, the Monument is for day use only, with occasional night hikes led by rangers. Most of the facilities are around 1,500 feet above sea level.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 76% of the year's daylight hours. This might range from a "low" of 50% in January, to a high of 91% in July. The year's lowest temperature should be close to 14°, and the highest should be near 109°. Sensible afternoon temperatures (the ones you feel) will be up to 4° cooler that actual ones, due to low humidity. You can expect daytime temperatures to drop an average of 1°F for each 300'-increase in elevation—and *vice versa* going downhill. As in all mountains, the direction the slope is facing makes a difference in how much sunshine and how much rain the slope gets, and therefore in its temperature and humidity.
