SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE BOISE AREA, IDAHO

LOCATION: Boise is located in southwestern Idaho. It is the state's capital and its largest city. The city is situated on the banks of the Boise River, a tributary of the Snake. North of the river, the city occupies the lower slopes of the Boise Mountains. South of the river, it sits on the river benches. Elevations vary, but the city center (north of the river) sits at about 2,850 feet.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is probable on 65% of the year's daylight hours. This might range from a low of 39% in December, to a high of 87% in July. The year's lowest temperature should be close to -3°, and the highest might well be near 104°. Sensible afternoon temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be essentially the same as actual ones from December through February, but up to 6° cooler than actual ones the rest of the year. The area has a standard midlatitude four-season year, with short hot summers and long cold winters. Precipitation is sparse, with most of it coming during the cooler months, some of it as snow. Typical summer afternoons are very sunny with quite low humidities and temperatures in the hot to very hot range. Summer nights are usually clear and cool. Typical winter afternoons are cloudy, humid, and cold. About a quarter of them will never warm above freezing. Winter nights are quite cold, with four out of five dropping below freezing. Snowfalls and snow flurries are common, but the ground is not snow-covered most winter days.
