SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE ABERDEEN AREA, SOUTH DAKOTA

LOCATION: Aberdeen is located in the northeastern quarter of the state of South Dakota. The town sits upon a relict glacial lake bed in that section of the Great Plains known as the Dacotah Prairies. The landscape is generally flat, with low hills to the east and west. Elevations are around 1,300 feet above sea level. Aberdeen is a major transportation center and market town for the surrounding area.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 56% of the year's daylight hours. This might range from a low of 42% in November, to a high of 68% in July and August. The year's lowest temperature should be close to -28°, and the highest should be near 103°. Sensible afternoon temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be essentially the same as actual ones. The climate is very much a continental one, with frequent and drastic changes in weather as storm systems move across the Great Plains from west to east. True blizzards are fairly rare, and don't occur in most years. However, "ground blizzards" characterized by high winds and blowing snow can make driving hazardous several times each winter. The summer thundershowers do not seem to prefer any particular time of day during the early part of the season, but tend to be more common in the evening and early nighttime hours in the latter part of the season.
