## SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE YAKIMA AREA, WASHINGTON

LOCATION: Yakima is located in the south-central part of Washington. The city sits astride the Yakima River within the heavily-irrigated and immensely fertile Yakima Basin. Elevations are around a thousand feet above sea level. The area lies withing the "rain shadow" of the Cascade Mountains just to the west. These mountains intercept the moisture-laden winds from the Pacific, leaving a "shadow" stretching many miles to the east where little rain falls.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 61% of the daylight hours of the year. This might range from a low of 29% in December, to a high of 80% in July. The lowest temperature of the year should be close to zero on some calm and clear winter sunrise, and the highest should be near 100 on some sunny and windless summer afternoon. Sensible temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be up to 4° cooler than actual ones during the summer months. A typical summer afternoon will be long, very sunny, quite arid, probably rainless, and quite hot--occasionally very hot. Summer nights are generally short, clear, and cool. A typical winter afternoon will be short, cloudy, humid, and raining about one day in three or four. It will also be cold, with about twenty winter days remaining below freezing all day. Winter nights are very cold, are almost always below freezing, and drop below zero on just over half the winters. Much of the winter precipitation comes as snow, but the ground is rarely snow-covered past noon of the next day.
