## SUNSHINE GUIDE TO THE CAP HAITIEN RESORT AREA, HAITI

LOCATION: The Cap Haitien resort area is located on the Caribbean coast of Haiti's Northern Province. The city is Haiti's second largest, after Port-au-Prince, and is usually referred to as Au-Cap (oh-CAPP). It is situated on the eastern shore of a small peninsula, facing Cap Haitien Bay. Attractions include the magnificent beaches west of town, the ruins of Henri Christophe's Sans Souci Palace, and the awesome Le Citadel Ferriere. Elevations range from sea level to almost 3,000 feet above it at Le Citadel. The city has a much more relaxed and pleasant feel to it than does the capital.

COMMENTS: Bright sunshine is likely on 68% of the daylight hours of the year. This might range from a low of 60% in May, to a high of 74% in February and March. The lowest temperature of the year should be close to  $60^{\circ}$  on some calm and clear winter sunrise, and the highest should be near  $100^{\circ}$  on some sunny and windless summer afternoon. Sensible temperatures (the ones you actually feel) will be from  $4^{\circ}$  to  $10^{\circ}$  warmer than actual ones, due to the humidity. Unless overwhelmed by passing storms, there is a regular daily alternation of land and sea breezes along the coastline, and for a short distance inland. During the day, the winds are off the sea. These sea breezes start before noon and will reach a peak in the late afternoon, when the temperature contrast between the land and the sea is greatest. Before midnight, the gentler land breezes start and blow from the land out to sea. They will reach their peak just about sunrise. This timing accounts for the common practice of sailing ships leaving port at dawn. The best weather comes in February and March.
